Executive Summary

1. Structure, governance and management

MWOK Humanitarian Organization is a fully registered National non-government organization/ charity with registration number 12200, regulated by the Registrar of Companies in Uganda.

It is constituted as a company limited by guarantee that was incorporated in 2015 and obtained a full registration with National NGO Board of Uganda by the Ministry of Internal Affairs on 16^{th} July 2016. The organization is bound by its Articles and Memorandum of Association.

The Board Members listed above are the directors of the organization and trustees of the charity. The management team holds executive responsibility for implementing the policies and strategies

of the organization approved by the Board.

2. Objectives, mission and activities

MWOK Humanitarian Organization is guided by development principles to marshal resources and contribute towards promoting Livelihoods, Disaster Risk Reduction and other related services under the following objectives:

- (i) Promote Nutrition and Food Security;
- (ii) Promote Water, Sanitation and Hygiene;
- (iii)Support and strengthening community health care systems;
- (iv) Capacity building on Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) for community members, local government, CBOS
- (v) Promote advocacy programs in support of community health including research, publications,
- (vi) To promote environmental preservation.
- (vii)To promote economic empowerment of communities through group economic activities.
- (viii)To promote micro finance and group savings and loans associations.
- (ix) Other services related to the ones above and within the laws of Uganda.

MWOK Humanitarian Organization mission fits within the objectives set out in their Memorandum and Articles of Association:

The organization is comprised of graduates in Public Health Disaster Management and practicing professionals and are well trained, inspired, passionate and professionally equipped to build the organization to be sustainable, to support the community and maintain progressive relationships with partners, stakeholders and community leaders as well.

3.Mission:-

Contribute to fighting climate change through community-based intervention for adaptation to bring positive change to communities through knowledge transformation to enhance local capacity towards building community resilience for long lasting/sustainable well-being and development.

4. Program activities:-

Integrated Livelihoods, Adolescent Health and Environmental Restoration (ILAHER Project) targeting refugees and hosts in Nakivale in Isingiro Districts in South West of Uganda.

ILAHER Project - include but not limited the following project activities:-

- (i) To establish a framework for co-operation in providing integrated livelihood programs for the youths and women
- (ii) To promote environmental protection and restoration mainstreamed with climate change adaption
- (iii) To enhance use of clean energy education and DRR interventions in Refugee Settlements in Uganda.

5.Project Deliverables

(i) Conducted one baseline survey.

Established and supported 10 youth livelihood groups in Nakivale Refugee Settlement Camp with a target of 90%

- (ii) Organized and facilitated 1 TOT on skills development, entrepreneurship and financial discipline/literacy, savings and overall business management (the target was 100%)
- (iii) Conducted 10 group-based trainings with a target of 100%
- (iv) Trained 100 youths in life long skills and entrepreneurship (Target >90%)
- (v) Developed and supported 10 business plans.
- (vi) Increased income of individual youth by 75%.
- (vii) Conducted 1 KAP survey to assess beneficiary satisfaction and practices.

6 . Key Achievements

(a) Baseline Assessment

This was conducted in project locations to establish the benchmark/targets for the pilot project and track progress/or achievements against the baseline indicators.

(b) Training Activities

- Trained 10 groups of (5 women and 5 males) on project management group and group savings for basic needs;
- · Trained 5 youth peer groups has helped in setting up framework and action plan for mobilizing adolescent youths in coordinating and implementing psychosocial counseling activities on unhealthy and risky behaviors including drug or alcohol abuse and HIV prevention.
- Trained 10 groups on agroforestry, tree growing, vegetable and fruits and food preservation and processing methods for vegetables to prevent post-harvest losses.

(c) Other Activities

The community outreach and dialogue has had significant impact on the communities in a way that, it has eased youth access to friendly ASRH services and as well improved family concerns on drugs and alcohol abuse including other risky behaviors which is critical mass in HIV prevention.

7. Challenges

The project is funded by MWOK founding members' contribution from their individual savings as some activities that require big sums of money could not be implemented from meager contributions.

· Material expectations from the beneficiaries, parents and adolescents expected

MWOK to provide girls the sanitary materials like soap, pads and start -up capital for adolescents who are out of school.

8. Recommendations

- · Dialogue and motivation to the youth groups through integration of livelihood an opportunity to harness harness available resource to earn a better living is paramount.
- · There is urgent need to have intervention in schools for pupils and teachers living with HIV/AIDS current coverage is very low.
- · There is need to integrate nutrition assessment and counseling in the ASRH services to promote good nutrition to address life cycle underlying factors of malnutrition.
